Your affiants, Detective Greg Renko and Detective Kevin L. McCue, are detectives with the Allegheny County Police Department, currently assigned to the Homicide Unit. Your affiants are law enforcement officers of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. All of the information contained in this affidavit was learned directly by your affiants or other investigators and police officers involved in this investigation. Any and all witnesses have been positively identified and will be available for all future court appearances.

On Saturday February 12, 2022 at approximately 12:06 pm, Monroeville Police were dispatched to the wooded area near 501 Rosecrest Drive for a possible dead body in the woods. Monroeville Police and EMS arrived on the scene and located a deceased female laying in the woods off of Rosecrest Drive.

The scene was secured, and Monroeville Police Chief Doug Cole requested the investigative assistance of the Allegheny County Police Homicide Unit. Sgt. Dolfi and Detectives Renko, Hermann, McCue, McKeel, Schlarp and Wateska responded to the scene along with Scientist Wauthier of the Allegheny County Office of the Medical Examiner's Mobile Crime Unit. The victim, subsequently identified as Christina Spicuzza, was located approximately fifty (50) feet off of the roadway in a body of woods. The victim appeared to be lying face down and was wearing a COVID face mask. One 9 mm casing, bearing a 9 mm Luger headstamp, was located behind Spicuzza. In between the victim and the roadway was a row of bushes/brush and a small creek.

While on scene, investigators learned that Christina Spicuzza was reported missing by her boyfriend Brandon Marto on February 11, 2022. Spicuzza was working as an UBER driver on the evening of February 10, 2022 when Marto last heard from her. While on scene, investigators learned that earlier that day, (February 12, 2022), the Pitcairn Police located Spicuzza's Gray Nissan Sentra bearing Virginia registration URX3971 at 505 4th Street in Pitcairn. Spicuzza's vehicle was locked, no keys appeared to be present, and it was unoccupied. The vehicle was secured and towed to Allegheny County Police Headquarters for processing. Spicuzza's vehicle was found to be a four-door dark gray Nissan Sentra, with a white license plate on the front and back of the vehicle. There was an UBER sticker in the front windshield on the passenger side and also an UBER sticker on the rear window along the driver side.

Detectives McKeel and McCue interviewed Brando Marto on February 12, 2022. Marto is Spicuzza's longtime, live in boyfriend. Marto stated that Spicuzza left their home Thursday (2/10/2022) in the evening to conduct UBER rides. Marto stated that Spicuzza regularly checks in with him while she is driving for UBER, but he had not heard from her since she left Monroeville to pick up a passenger in Pitcairn around 9:00 PM on February 10, 2022. Marto stated that he purchased a dash camera for Spicuzza and it is normally inside her vehicle. Marto observed the camera in Spicuzza's vehicle when she left the house on February 10, 2022 but when he went to the vehicle recovery site on Fourth Street in Pitcairn, he saw that it was not inside the vehicle in its usual place. Marto was able to provide detectives with a description and make/model of the camera through his purchase receipt. Marto described the camera as a Blueskysea B2W 1080P HD Dash Camera. Marto provided that while driving for UBER, Spicuzza would leave her cell phone plugged in to a car charger at all times because otherwise her cell phone battery would die. Spicuzza's cell phone was not located on either her person, in the vicinity of her remains, or in her vehicle. Brandon Marto provided that it was an Apple Iphone, pink in color, with a religious message as a screen saver. Marto provided Detective McCue with the password to the phone. During processing, neither Spicuzza's cell phone nor the in-car camera were located inside the vehicle.

On February 12, 2022, Detective Schlarp contacted UBER to obtain trip information for Spicuzza. It was learned that Spicuzza's

last completed trip began at 9:13 PM on February 10, 2022 from 201 Brinton Road. The ride was requested by UBER account holder Tanaya Mullen (DOB 5/16/1999). Mullen's Pennsylvania ID address is listed as 201 Brinton Road, Pitcairn. The requested trip was for travel to 8514 Dersam Drive in Penn Hills, PA.

On February 12, 2022, Monroeville Police were contacted by an individual, herein referred to as Witness #1. Witness #1 was working along the railroad tracks beneath the TriBoro Expressway on Friday, February 11, 2022 when he/she observed a pink cell phone with cracked screen. Witness #1 attempted to access the phone to return it to its owner, but discovered that it was password protected, charged, and in "Airplane Mode." Witness #1 took Detectives McKeel and McCue to the recovery location. Detective McCue entered the password provided by Brandon Marto to the phone and the phone immediately unlocked. A religious verse was in the background and a subsequent download of the phone revealed that the number was Spicuzza's cell phone number.

On February 13, 2022, Dr. Luckasevic performed a postmortem examination on Spicuzza. Dr. Luckasevic stated that in his medical opinion, Spicuzza died late Thursday (2/10/2022) or early Friday (2/11/2022). Dr. Luckasevic stated that Spicuzza died from a single gunshot wound that entered her head on the back left side and exited out of her right cheek. Dr. Luckasevic concluded that the cause of death was a gunshot wound to the head and the manner of death, homicide.

A check of License Plate Readers for Spicuzza's license plate number URX3971 revealed the following "hits." At 10:12:16pm on February 10, 2022, Spicuzza's vehicle hits on the License Plate Reader, traveling eastbound on Tri Boro Expressway at Monroeville Avenue. At 10:34:51pm, Spicuzza's vehicle is traveling westbound on Route 30 at Route 48. At 10:38:49pm, Spicuzza's vehicle is traveling westbound at Route 30 and Warren Drive. At 10:39:18 PM, Spicuzza's vehicle is traveling westbound on Clyde Drive. On February 11, 2022, at 12:11:24 AM Spicuzza's vehicle is traveling eastbound on TriBoro Expressway at Monroeville Avenue.

ACP Detectives were able to download Spicuzza's cell phone and learn her cell phone locations through the location services on the phone. The data confirmed that Spicuzza arrived in the general area of 201 Brinton Avenue in Pitcairn at 9:13 pm on February 10, 2022 and drove to the area of 8505 Dersam Street in Penn Hills, arriving at approximately 9:33pm. The download of Spicuzza's cell phone revealed that at 9:33 PM, her cell phone was removed from the charger. As detectives previously learned from Brandon Marto, Spicuzza always kept her phone on a car charger while driving UBER because the location apps and navigation drained the battery if she did not.

Between approximately 9:38 PM and 9:40 PM on February 10, 2022, Spicuzza's phone is on Wallace Avenue, Wilkinsburg. While on Wallace Avenue, the following apps on Spicuzza's phone are accessed: Dollar Bank, PayPal, SquareUp Cash, and Venmo. Your affiants are aware that these apps are all forms of money transfer. A check of Spicuzza's accounts with these apps revealed that she had no recent activity on the Paypal, SquareUP and Venmo accounts. Brandon Marto told Detectives McCue and McKeel that they use Dollar Bank mobile app for UBER payments and transfers. According to Brandon Marto, the two were very low on cash. Marto stated that in his last phone call with Spicuzza, Spicuzza told him that she spent the last of her available funds at Steel City Vape in Monroeville just before leaving for the UBER trip requested by Mullen.

An examination of location data on Spicuzza's Apple Iphone, which is updated approximately every 2 seconds, revealed that

Spicuzza's phone travels generally towards Tri Boro Expressway, at 10:11 PM. This is consistent with the previously described license plate reader hit at Tri Boro Expressway and Monroeville Avenue at 10:12 PM on February 10, 2022. At approximately 10:20 PM on February 10, 2022, Spicuzza's phone is in the general vicinity of 501 Rosecrest Drive, where she is discovered deceased. Spicuzza's phone device activity shows that Spicuzza's phone transitions from Bluetooth to speaker at 10:20:57 PM, which is consistent with the car being turned off and/or the phone leaving the car. The phone reconnects to the car's Bluetooth at 10:24:18 and the phone travels back down Rosecrest the way it came. At 10:27:11 the device is put on Airplane but continues to have location data updated.

Spicuzza's cell phone goes generally towards Pitcairn via Wall Avenue, travels through Merchant Alley at 10:28 PM then travels along Brinton Road, Broadway Boulevard, and arrives on Mossy Side Boulevard at 10:30 PM. At 10:32 PM, Spicuzza's phone revealed activity on the Dollar Bank app. Spicuzza's phone remained connected to Bluetooth until 10:34:18 PM, when it was disconnected and showed her phone traveling along Rt. 30 towards the Westinghouse Bridge. As previously described, at 10:34:51pm, Spicuzza's vehicle is traveling westbound on Route 30 at Route 48. At 10:38:49pm, Spicuzza's vehicle hits a license plate reader traveling westbound at Route 30 and Warren Drive. At 10:39:18 PM, Spicuzza's vehicle hits a license plate reader traveling westbound on Clyde Drive. According to the location services on Spicuzza's, her cell phone stops moving at 10:39 PM. After that time, Spicuzza's phone remains in the general area where it was found by Witness #1 on February 11, 2022. The device activity indicates that her phone connected to the car Bluetooth from 10:24:18 PM and continued to be connected until 10:39:48 PM.

Detective McCue made contact with Tanaya Mullen on February 14, 2022 and asked to speak with her. Mullen agreed to meet Detectives McCue and Renko at the Penn Hills Police Station. When Mullen arrived at the Penn Hills Police station, she was accompanied by her boyfriend, Calvin Crew (DOB 4/19/1999). Mullen indicated that Crew also resides at 201 Brinton Avenue, Pitcairn.

Penn Hills Police Detective Lape was previously aware that Crew had an outstanding warrant from Northern Regional Police Department, and Crew was taken into custody under that warrant at 4:40 PM. Prior to being placed in a holding cell, Crew was searched incident to arrest and a blue Apple iPhone with a black case was recovered from his person. Detective McCue previously observed Crew typing on that cell phone in the lobby of the Penn Hills Police Station upon his arrival there. Detective McKeel applied for and was granted a search warrant to seize the blue Apple iPhone with black case seized from Crew at the time of his arrest. Crew informed Detective Lape that his cell phone number was (989) 382-1109. During the interview, Detective McCue asked Mullen what phone number she has for Crew. Mullen provided (202) 688-9487. Detective McCue asked Mullen if that was the same phone and phone number associated with the device that Crew had on him at this time, and she stated yes.

Mullen was interviewed by Detectives McCue and Renko. She stated that she was in Swissvale on the evening of February 10, 2022 when she received a call from Crew asking her to order an UBER for him. Mullen stated that Crew gave her an address on 8514 Dersam Street to enter into the ride request. Mullen confirmed that she did order the UBER for Crew at 8:53 PM with a pickup address of 201 Brinton Avenue and paid for the trip on her Apple Pay account. Mullen showed Detectives McCue and Renko the trip request on her cell phone using the UBER App.

Mullen stated that at 10:27 PM on February 10, 2022, she received a FaceTime phone call from Crew, cell phone number (202) 688-9487, asking her when she was going to be home. Mullen stated that it was dark in the background of wherever he was

calling from. At 12:26 AM (February 11, 2022), Mullen called Crew via FaceTime and when he answered, he was on the porch of 201 Brinton Avenue, stating that he was locked out. They talked for seven (7) minutes, she then called him back at approximately 12:33 AM (February 11, 2022), and he was still on the front porch and they discussed how long it would take her to get home to let him in. Mullen stated that when she arrived back at 201 Brinton Avenue, Pitcairn at approximately 1:30 AM on February 11, 2022, Crew was at the residence.

In an interview with your affiants, Mullen stated that she purchased a "Springdale" arms 9 mm gun at a store in McKeesport. She stated that she never bought any ammunition for it but bought it for protection. A check of records at Legion Arms revealed that Mullen purchased a Springfield Arms XDS 9 mm pistol on July 20, 2021. When Mullen asked where the gun was currently, she stated that the gun went missing when she took it to a birthday party for a member of Crew's family. Mullen stated that she never reported it missing/stolen because the next day she gave birth to her son, then spent time in and out of the hospital with COVID. Mullen stated that she still had the gun box and paperwork at her residence located at 201 Brinton Avenue, Pitcairn. Mullen confirmed that Crew did attempt to borrow the gun from her after she bought it, but "didn't put it in words." When Mullen was asked if she had a feeling that Crew had her gone, she stated "yeah." She agreed that he was the only person around her, but Crew denied to her that he had taken it.

Mullen agreed to turn over the gun box from her home. Detectives McKeel and Canofari took Mullen to the residence and immediately went to an entertainment center in her bedroom. Mullen stated that the box is normally there, and only she and Crew have keys to the apartment. Mullen stated that she did not move or dispose of the box. She continued to search the residence and allowed detectives to assist her. The gun box was not found within the residence. Mullen stated that she had the paperwork in a separate drawer, and it also appeared to be missing.

Detectives McCue and Renko interviewed Calvin Crew on February 14, 2022. Crew was advised of his Miranda Rights. Crew agreed to waive his Miranda Rights and speak to detectives regarding the UBER trip ordered for him by Mullen on February 10, 2022. When Detective McCue asked Crew what his phone number was, he stated that he doesn't have a phone and to just use "her" phone number. Crew confirmed that he had Mullen order an UBER for him to Dersam Street location because he had to go to the address on Pershing to get mail and tax return information. Crew explained that his actual destination was on 8526 Pershing Street, but he gave the 8514 Dersam Street because GPS navigation does not take UBER to the Pershing Street address. He stated that a white woman picked him up in dark gray car and drove him to that location. Once he got there, the trip ended, and he went to his destination.

During the interview with Crew, Crew stated that after he got out of the Uber he went and retrieved his mail from 8526 Pershing Street. From there he stated that he then walked to the bus station in Wilkinsburg that is on the busway.

Crew stated that he then took the Trafford bus from Wilkinsburg to Pitcairn, he stated that he got off the bus in Pitcairn near the police station and then walked up Brinton Avenue to his house. Crew was advised that the Borough of Pitcairn has a video surveillance camera located at the intersection of Broadway Blvd and Brinton Avenue so it should show Crew walking up Brinton Avenue. Crew stated that he was wearing a dark puffy coat and gray sweatpants so it shouldn't be hard to find him. Crew told detectives that he arrived there before midnight.

Allegheny County Police Homicide Detectives reviewed the surveillance camera from the Borough of Pitcairn from 10:00 pm on February 10, 2022 until 12:30 am on February 11, 2022. Detectives did not observe any individual matching Crew's description walking near or up Brinton Avenue on the date and time Crew stated that he should be walking up Brinton Avenue. ACP Detectives reviewed Port Authority video from the Wilksburg Bus Stations on February 10th, 2022 from 9:30pm until 12:00am on February 11th, 2022. While reviewing these videos, ACP Detectives do not observe Crew entering a bus from any station.

On Tuesday, February 15, 2022, Detective Hitchings went to 8526 Pershing Street and spoke with current occupant, Tremayne Wilmer B/M. Det. Hitchings explained to Tremayne that Detectives from the Allegheny County Police Homicide Unit were investigating a recent homicide and a suspect told police that he (Calvin Crew) came to 8526 Pershing Street on Thursday, February 10, 2022 around 9:30 pm to check and see if he had any mail there.

Tremayne said he has been living at 8526 Pershing Street for approximately 2 months and said he does not know Calvin Crew however Crew sometimes gets mail delivered to the address and he gives it to his landlord, Adam West. Tremayne said no one came to his house on Thursday night.

Det. Hitchings then contacted Adam West regarding Calvin Crew and West stated the following:

West said Calvin Crew and his mother, Tenisha Williams moved out of 8526 Pershing Street over a year ago. West said when mail for them is delivered to the residence he (West) marks on it return to sender and gives it back to the post office.

On Tuesday, February 15, 2022, Detective Hitchings along with Detective Nicole DePaoli went to 304 Pheasant Drive, Penn Hills PA 15235 to speak with Tenisha Williams regarding her son, Calvin Crew's interview regarding the Christina Spicuzza Homicide Investigation.

Upon their arrival at 304 Pheasant Street, they identified themselves as Allegheny County Police Homicide Detectives and were assisting in the homicide investigation of an Uber driver. Tenisha Williams invited Detectives into the residence. Tenisha sat on the steps leading to the second floor of the residence and Calvin Crew came from the dining room and sat on the steps next to his mother. There was also a middle-aged male sitting on the couch in the living room.

Detectives asked Tenisha if she was still receiving mail at 8526 Pershing Street. Tenisha said that if any of their mail is delivered to 8526 Pershing Street her old landlord, Adam West would return the mail to the post office and it would be forwarded to her.

Detectives then explained to Tenisha that Calvin told Detectives that he took an Uber to 8505 Dursam Street on Thursday, February 10, 2022 to pick up his mail and then he walked to the Wilksburg Station on the bus way and took the Trafford bus back to Pitcairn.

Calvin inserted himself into the interview and said he did not know if there was mail there or not, he wanted to check and see because its tax time and he wanted to get his taxes done. Calvin said he never knocked on the door on Pershing Street he just checked the mailbox and left.

Detectives then explained to Tenisha that Calvin told Detectives in his interview that he was wearing black jacket and gray sweatpants and that Detectives were in the process of obtaining the bus video from the Port Authority to confirm Calvin's story. Calvin again inserted himself into the interview and said he was wearing a black puffy coat and he got onto the 68 or 69 Trafford Bus.

On February 15, 2022, Mullen consented to a search of the cell phone she communicated with Crew on February 10, 2022 and February 11, 2022. A review of the cell phone revealed that after she ordered the UBER for Crew, Crew's last outgoing activity to her before the ride occurred at 9:11 PM on 2/10/2022. Mullen sent Crew several text messages, one at 9:28 PM and one at 9:42 PM. The 9:42 PM text from Mullen to Crew stated, "Whatever you doing tonight be careful." At 10:30:48 PM, Crew's phone sends Mullen's phone a message stating "Trynna send bev a dub so I can grab some gas." Crew responded to the 9:42 PM text message by "loving" the message at 10:31:08 PM. At 10:33 PM, a phone call lasting over 4 minutes is received from Crew's phone by Mullen's. At 10:34 PM, Mullen's phone accesses Squareup cash app. At 10:51:55 PM, Mullen's cell phone sends Crew's phone a message stating "Cash app on weird shit stg ima try again in alil and restart my phone I'm sending it but its not completing." On February 11, 2022 at 10:54 PM, Mullen sends Crew a message stating "Im not going to jail if we get caught."

On February 15, 2022, Detectives McCue and McKeel applied for a search warrant to download and review the contents of the blue Apple Iphone with a black case recovered from Crew at the time of his arrest by Penn Hills Police. During a review of the Iphone, it was noted that the Apple ID assigned to this device is calvincrew17@icloud.com. Device connectivity activities present indicated that at 2/10/2022 10:42:15 PM the device connected to an unnamed WiFi network. Location services for the phone revealed that at 10:44 PM, Crew's cell phone arrived on Howard Street in East Pittsburgh after a 1 hour, 29-minute drive. The location services indicated that Crew's phone was on Howard Street from 10:44 PM to 12:06 AM February 11, 2022. It should be noted that 1 hour 29 minutes is the amount of time that elapsed from Spicuzza's UBER trip commencing at Brinton Avenue.

After doing a review of the location services on Spicuzza's phone, your affiants are aware that her device was in the area where she was found deceased from approximately 10:20 PM on February 10, 2022 until 10:24 PM. Spicuzza's phone device activity shows that Spicuzza's phone transitions from Bluetooth to speaker at 10:20:57 PM, which is consistent with the car being turned off and/or the phone leaving the car. The phone reconnects to the car's Bluetooth at 10:24:18 and the phone travels back down Rosecrest the way it came. A review of Crew's cell phone device activities at this time showed that at 10:23 PM, the device's display screen was activated.

On February 16, 2022 Detectives from the Allegheny County Police Department conducted a canvass of Howard Street. Video footage from a residence on the 400 block of Howard Street, East Pittsburgh, showed that at 10:41:23, a dark colored car with white front license plate turns onto Howard Street from Main Street. It should be noted that Spicuzza's vehicle is a gray Nissan Sedan with white front license plate. A dark, single figure emerges from the driver's seat and walks along a fence between 423 Howard Street and 427 Howard Street, East Pittsburgh. The interior light of 427 Howard Street becomes visible briefly around that time. At 12:05:20 AM, a figure appears to emerge from 427 Howard Street and gets into the previously described dark vehicle with white front plate. The person enters the driver's side at 12:05:52 AM on February 11, 2022 and pulls away at 12:06:25 AM on February 11, 2022. This is consistent with the previously described cell phone activity showing Crew's phone being on Howard Street, East Pittsburgh from 10:44 PM on February 10, 2022 until approximately 12:06 AM on February 11, 2022.

On February 16, 2022, Detective Renko went to 427 Howard Street, East Pittsburgh and made contact with Laneice Hester, who identified herself as the resident of 427 Howard Street and the blood cousin of Calvin Crew. Hester stated that she does not have a phone number for Crew, and that she contacts him through his Apple Id Calvincrew17@icloud.com. Hester indicated that Crew has been to her residence numerous times. Hester stated that on February 10, 2022, she missed two Facetime calls from Crew at 10:40 PM and 11:10 PM, but Hester could not recall if Crew was at her residence at that time. A time and distance review from the end of the Westinghouse Bridge to 427 Howard Street, East Pittsburgh is approximately .5 miles and 3 minutes to travel.

At 12:11 AM on February 11, 2022, Spicuzza's vehicle, the Nissan Sentra bearing Virginia Registration URX3971 hits on a License Plate Reader located at Monroeville Avenue and the TriBoro Expressway, Turtle Creek, PA. A time distance study from 427 Howard Street, East Pittsburgh PA to the intersection of Monroeville Avenue and TriBoro Expressway, Turtle Creek, PA revealed that it takes approximately 6 minutes to cover the distance using two options. Travelling via Braddock Avenue, the distance is 1.6 miles and traveling via Tri-Boro Expressway the distance is 1.7 miles.

Detectives obtained and reviewed video surveillance from a residence on Fourth Street in Pitcairn, which is located within the same block as Spicuzza's vehicle was recovered. The camera angle includes the area in front of 505 Fourth Street, Pitcairn. A dark colored vehicle with a front license plate appears to circle the block at 12:16 AM and 12:17 AM. At 12:19 AM, lights flicker in front of 505 4th Street, and then moments later a lone figure is seen walking from the area in front of 505 Fourth Street, walking down Corliss Way. It should be noted that this area is .2 miles from Crew and Mullen's residence at 201 Brinton Avenue. The address of 201 Brinton Avenue is in the general direction the individual is seen walking towards.

On February 16, 2022, Detective Nicole DePaoli reviewed exterior surveillance camera footage from Lanigan Patrick T Funeral Home Inc located at 700 Linden Avenue. Detective DePaoli was able to view at approximately 12:08 am, a dark color vehicle with a front license plate (similar characteristics of the victim's vehicle) travel down Linden Avenue towards the Tri-Boro Expressway.

As previously noted, on February 11, 2022 at approximately 12:11 am the victim's vehicle license plate was captured on and LPR at the intersection of Tri-boro Expressway @ Monroeville Avenue. Victims' vehicle was traveling from East Pittsburgh towards Pitcairn. A time and distance study shows that from 700 Linden Avenue to the intersection of Tri-boro Expressway @ Monroeville Avenue is approximately 1.0 miles and would take 3 minutes to travel that distance.

On Thursday February 17th, 2022, ACP Detective Oesterle was canvassing the area of Dersam Street in Penn Hills. While canvassing the area, Detective Oesterle located the missing Blueskysea B2W HD Dash Camera that was missing from Spicuzza's vehicle. The camera was located along a chain link fence next to the detached garage belonging to 8421 Dersam Street. 8421 Dersam Street is .1 miles from 8514 Dersam Street, which is the address that Crew requested the UBER take him to. Detective Oesterle secured the camera and transported it back to ACP HQ.

Your affiants located a mini-sd card inside of the camera and were able to view the footage from the mini-sd card. While viewing the footage, the footage is date and time stamped. The time is accurate; however, the date is observed to be one day behind. The video is recorded from the front and rear of the camera, showing the front exterior of the car and the interior passenger compartment of the vehicle. The camera also records audio from inside of the vehicle.

While reviewing the video of the interior passenger compartment, we observe the following at the listed times.

21:14:32: Person with hood up in dark clothing emerges from between 139 Brinton Avenue and 201 Brinton.

At 21:14:42: Crew enters car, Spicuzza turns and states "For Tanaya" and Crew does not respond.

21:33:28: We are able to hear the UBER application announcing, "Drop off Tanaya"

21:33:45: Crew produces a firearm from his right side and leans forward toward Spicuzza.

21:33:47: Crew places his left hand on Spicuzza's left shoulder.

21:33:49: Crew states "Keep driving". Crew then places the firearm at the back of Spicuzza's head, with the firearm being in his right hand.

21:33:51: Spicuzza reaches up with her right hand and touches the gun. Spicuzza then says "You've got to be joking"
 21:33:55: Crew states "It's a gun"
 21:33:57: Spicuzza states "Come on, I have a family"
 21:33:58: Crew states "I got a family too, now drive"
 21:34:10: Crew says to Spicuzza "Complete the trip". He repeats this statement numerous times to her
 21:34:20: Crew using his left hand, grabbed Spicuzza's ponytail and controlled her head
 21:34:23: Spicuzza says "I'm begging you, I have four kids"
 21:34:39: Crew places the firearm into his left hand and keeps it placed at the back of Spicuzza's neck.
 21:34:40: Spicuzza says "Please take that off of me"
 21:34:42: Crew reaches forward with his right hand and grabs Spicuzza's cell phone off of the front dashboard.

Your affiants requested Calvin Crew's criminal history through Allegheny County 911 and learned that in December of 2014, Crew was adjudicated for a Robbery. Your affiants also checked Crew through NCIC/CLEAN and determined that on 2/10/22 that Crew did not possess a valid license to carry a firearm.

Your affiant believes that good cause exists for delaying the dissemination of this arrest warrant information to include the arrest warrant and the affidavit of probable cause based on the following facts: 1) revealing the fact that an arrest warrant exists would allow or enable that actor to flee or to destroy evidence related to the crime(s); 2) delaying the fact that an arrest warrant exists is necessary to protect the safety of law enforcement officers executing the arrest warrant; and 3) delaying the dissemination of the affidavit of probable cause will preserve the integrity of this investigation.

Your affiant and the Allegheny County District Attorney's Office believe that there are no reasonable alternative means available to protect the interests threatened by disclosure of this affidavit of probable cause and the arrest warrant.

This affidavit of probable cause has been reviewed by DDA Chernosky who respectfully requests that the dissemination of this criminal complaint and arrest warrant be delayed by 72 hours to preserve the integrity of this investigation under the authority of he Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure 513 C.
